THE ASK: Since her clients didn't want to leave their family home but *did* need more room to grow, designer Olivia Botrie knew she would need to get creative. The Dart Studio designer began by spearheading a modest twostorey expansion of 75 square feet per floor. This opened things up significantly in the kitchen, and got the owners' creative juices flowing. More storage and counter space, a devoted eating area and a stronger visual connection to their backyard were all top priority. An open-concept design, however, wasn't: "They liked the cosy feel of their old home," says Olivia.

THE OUTCOME: In addition to offering more workspace, a sweet dining spot and outdoor views, this renovation also brought the owners' designer kitchen dreams to life. "They had an inspiration shot of a gorgeous Joseph Conran kitchen featuring pale green

cabinetry with warm wood and Carrara marble," says Olivia. She opted for barely-there sage cabinets, engineered white oak floors and spindle-back chairs for a similar heritage vibe. A minimal pendant light and flat-front doors throw a bit of modern style into the mix. "It's a kitchen that speaks to both contemporary and traditional sensibilities," she says.

"I love the neutral tone and spare, clean quality of the floors," says Olivia.


